There are three bills before the legislature this session that impact the mining industry; all would increase the tax on this industry. This is an interesting industry that is prevalent throughout our state but not realized by most of us. He will explain the impact the legislation will have on this industry.

REPORT ON CURRENT / PENDING LEGISLATION

AB356 -WATER USAGE- Banning nonfunctional, decorative grass by 2026. Water, Water, Where are you?

Assembly Joint Resolution 10- WAGES- Amends the state constitution to raise the minimum age to \$12. And to raise it when the legislature wants to. What happened to supply and demand and right to work?

AB126 – ELECTIONS – PRIMARY - This bill could lead to having Nevada be the first state to have a primary for the next general election. We are a caucus state now.

AB321 – ELECTIONS – This bill makes it a permanent law to have our general election access to voting similar to what we had during the 2020 November election. Is this what we want?

AB422 – ELECTIONS – This bill centralizes and manages all voter registration data with the Secretary of State. Is this a good idea?

AB432 – ELECTIONS – VOTER REGISTRATION – This bill will allow the expansion of automatic voter registration locations beyond the DMV. Is this a good idea? Is the DMV a good idea?

AB286 – GUN CONTROL – This bill bans Ghost Guns, allows assembly of guns from parts that are not identified by numbers. Among other things, it talks about CCW permit holders carrying on public property.

Please continue to email, write letters, make phone calls to the committee chairs, and our legislators about bills you would like them to know your opinion. It does make a difference especially when you use your own words. Thank them for support of those they voted favorably on. These last days of May will be full of changes, votes and more changes. Keep up to date and make your voice heard.


All of these groups will welcome you to attend their meetings, receive their newsletters, volunteer in their various outreach programs and of course—DONATE cash to support their efforts.

CCRCC meetings typically meet the third Tuesday every other month. Of course, nothing has been typical in the past year and they've been very constrained by the Governor's meeting mandates. You may sign up on the website by completing a new member application (<https://clarkgop.org/application.html>). You will then receive notices from the CCRCC and can attend the next meeting, although voting privileges are not established until the second meeting. The CCRCC mission is:

- Increasing Republican voter registrations.
- Identifying, recruiting, and supporting Republican candidates for office.
- Establishing ongoing efforts to raise money to promote Republican candidates.
- Concentrating on grass roots efforts in local communities
- Participating in community functions so the Republican brand is better
- Increasing Republican voter turnout by increasing voter awareness, reaching out to voters and provide rides when necessary.
- Always being organized and professional.

The 81st Session of the Nevada Legislature has been in session for 90 days, but not to the public or lobbyists. The information that the public and lobbyist provide to legislators helps them learn and be educated about issues. Legislators cannot be expected to know all! So, call, email or write letters to them and let them know what you know and your opinion. *Now open by appointment!*



AB19

This bill eliminates the study of government as part of the curricula and substitutes in place “multicultural” education. 1) Eliminating knowledge of how our country is governed relative to other types of government opens up the student to accept propoganda in support of socialist systems. AB286

I would like to suggest that you allow/make an amendment to your bill which excludes the part that makes it a misdemeanor to conceal carry in areas in which notification has been posted. A notice restricting arms on the property may not be observed by the patron and as such the patron would be unknowingly criminally liable.

At present, the law allows concealed carry in an establishment unless the act of concealed carry is noticed and the owner or safety officer on duty requests that the gun be removed from the premises. CRAIG SMITH REPORTS ON THE CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

Clark County School Board, March 25, 2021

The Board approved an "Amendment of Clark County School District Regulation 6150. This regulation provides for the selection and provision of instructional materials within CCSD. Most changes in the regulation were language changes to ensure that CCSD will be inclusive and responsive to the diversity of persons without discrimination or segregation on the grounds of race, color, creed/religion, national or ethnic origin, sex, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, disability, marital status or age, and in accordance with the financial resources of the District.

There were a number of written comments from the Public and organizations such as Nevada Immigrant Coalition concerning adoption of Anti-racist policies.

IS IT A TAX INCREASE?

If you must pay more in tax in July because the Clark County commissioners voted last week, Is that a tax increase?

At the March commissioners meeting they voted to remove the “SUNSET” clause from the sales tax increase set to expire in July.

That is a 1/8 of a cent sales tax levy that was passed in 2019 which was to expire in July of 2021. It brings in \$50 million a year and they just cannot do without it. Although they do not have any urgent need, they just want to help fight homelessness, promote affordable housing, and early childhood education programs. Where has that money been going? Lots of luck in finding that answer. Education is not within the County preview and what have they done for affordable housing or homelessness? But they cannot do without the money, so removing the “SUNSET” is done. Thus, you are paying more tax in July then you would have been without the vote. Is it a tax increase or not? You decide.
